### 2025 Fast Facts

- ✓ Yosemite Conservancy has provided more than a century of service to and philanthropic partnership with Yosemite National Park.
- In recent years, we have provided more than \$172 million in grants to Yosemite for more than 900 projects. We also help secure matching funds for major projects and provides in-kind donations of staffing, services, and park-based programming.
- ✓ In 2025, we are providing \$18 million in total support and funding around 60 new grants to the National Park Service for projects in the park.
- ✓ Major grants: research and projects to protect giant sequoias; improving safety on the Mist Trail, one of the most popular National Park trails; restoring Ackerson Meadow.
- ✓ Other grant focuses include environmental resilience, protecting threatened and rare species, and prioritizing Tribal inclusion and Tribal-led projects.
- ✓ More than 700,000 people will benefit from Conservancy-run programs and services, and millions will benefit from Conservancy-funded projects that improve the visitor experience.
- $\checkmark$  More than 58,000 donors contributed to Yosemite Conservancy last year.

- For more than 100 years, the Conservancy has been supporting the conservation of Yosemite's natural resources and helping people develop deep ties to the park.
- In recent years, we have provided more than \$172 million in grants to Yosemite for more than 900 completed projects. We also help secure matching funds for major projects and provides in-kind donations of staffing, services, and park-based programming. Thanks to (donors like) you, we'll provide a record \$18 million in total support to the park in 2024.
- Your support makes possible a wide variety of important projects and programs in Yosemite, from restoration and research to art classes and volunteer opportunities.
- Many Conservancy-funded grants this year support efforts to make the park more environmentally resilient in the face of climate change, protect threatened and rare species, and elevate Tribal voices and Tribal-led projects.

- Donors help the park complete many important projects that otherwise would not be possible. Your gifts fund grants to restore trails and habitat, protect wildlife, inspire young people to take care of the natural world, and much more.
- You can see the impact of our donors' gifts throughout Yosemite, including the new Welcome Center and Exploration Center in Yosemite Valley, and at <u>renovated overlooks</u> and vista points, such <u>Bridalveil Fall</u>, Tenaya Lake, and Yosemite Falls; at Tunnel View, Olmsted Point, and Glacier Point; and in the restored <u>Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequioas</u>.
- In 2025, we are funding grants to the National Park Service for around 60 new projects in Yosemite. We need your help to support projects that will restore trails and ecosystems, propel scientific and historical research, protect wildlife, and facilitate positive visitor experiences.
- Many of our 2025 grants focus on environmental resilience, protecting habitats and threatened species, providing educational programs and resources, and helping Yosemite to be more inclusive and accessible to a diverse audience. A few examples include:
  - o Research and projects to protect giant sequoias
  - 0 Improving safety on the Mist Trail, one of the most popular National Park trails
  - o Restoring Ackerson Meadow
  - o Development of the Wahhoga Indian Cultural site
- We are continuing to assess the impact of climate-driven changes to the habitats of bats the impact of climate-driven changes to the habitats of bats, fishers, and other species that call Yosemite home. Other transformative projects include inspiring future nature stewards through the Junior Ranger and Expanding Horizons programs, preserving cultural resources and stories through events and traditional practices, and enhancing visitor engagement with ranger-led Night Sky programs.

- More than **700,000 people** will benefit from Conservancy-run programs and services in the park in 2025 and millions will benefit from Conservancy-funded projects that improve the visitor experience.
- Funds from our art, adventure, and volunteer programs; bookstores; and wilderness services support essential work in the park.
- The Conservancy's **year-round** <u>Outdoor Adventures</u> and <u>Custom Adventures</u> are a great way to experience Yosemite in a new way, in any season. Our knowledgeable naturalist guides lead day hikes, backpacking trips, birding walks, Yosemite Field School courses on climate change, park history and ecology, and more.
- Happy Isles Art and Nature Center offers a variety of art classes in Yosemite Valley led by professional

artists, from April through October, for all ages.

- Our <u>volunteers</u> help restore habitat and trails, support Preventive Search and Rescue (PSAR) activities, and provide valuable assistance to park visitors.
- Our <u>bookstores</u> in the park and online offer first-rate Yosemite products, including locally designed apparel and gifts. We carry a wide selection of books, including many published by the Conservancy, as well as helpful maps and guides.
- Our wilderness team helps operate the <u>Ostrander Ski Hut</u>, and they help backcountry travelers reserve <u>wilderness permits</u> and rent bear-proof food canisters.
